6. Professional Services for Project SBAC J0046—Buchholz/Eastside/Hawthorne/Loften/Newberry High Schools Tennis Courts Gable

On October 15, 2002, the Board approved Kelley Engineering, Inc., Gainesville, Florida, as the design professional for the above referenced project. It is requested that the Board approve a negotiated fee of 8.5% of the construction cost for professional services on this project.

7. Certificates of Final Inspection Gable

- a. Certificate of Final Inspection for Project SBAC CF315—Stephen Foster Elementary School Student Services Remodeling

The project architect and the facilities department staff have inspected this project. It is requested that the Board authorize final payment to the contractor upon total acceptance. Final contract amount is \$461,479.16.

- b. Certificate of Final Inspection for Project SBAC CA715—Hawthorne Jr./Sr. High School Animal Production and Technology Center

The project architect and the facilities department staff have inspected this project. It is requested that the Board authorize final payment to the contractor upon total acceptance. Final contract amount is \$1,246,272.34.

8. Design Development Documents for Project SBAC CC632—Westwood Middle School Food Service Building Gable

Craig Salley & Associates, Architects, Gainesville, Florida, has prepared Design Development Documents for the construction of this project. It is recommended these plans be approved as presented.

9. Adult Education Omer

A proposal has been prepared for submission to the Florida Department of Education for funds to support the district's adult education program. This

program provides services to adults who lack the level of literacy necessary to become effective citizens and gain productive employment. The program targets adults with less than 9th grade skills, undereducated adults in the workplace, adults with limited English skills, at risk youth, and adults with disabilities. A total of \$71,912 is requested.

- 10. Agreement with the Gainesville Association for the Creative Arts Omer

An agreement has been prepared with the Gainesville Association for the Creative Arts to provide a Summer Arts Infusion program for students at Duval Elementary School. Grant funds of \$7,444 are provided specifically for this purpose.

- 11. Full Service Schools Omer

A contract has been prepared with the Alachua county Health Department to continue the Full Service Schools program operated through Family Services sites at Alachua and the Fearnside Center. A total of \$148,501.92 is provided.

- 12. Tech Prep Articulation Agreements with Santa Fe Community College Edwards

Students who complete Tech Prep articulated programs in career and technical education are eligible to receive advanced credit standing at Santa Fe on the basis of program completion and successful completion of a competency exam. The agreements include Computer Information Technology A.S. Degree; Computer Programming and Analysis A.S. Degree; Information Technology Management Certificate; Information Technology Technician Certificate; and Networking Services Technology A.S. Degree.

- 13. Carl D. Perkins Vocational and Applied Technical Education Grant Edwards

The purpose of this grant is to develop more fully the academic, vocational, and technical skills of secondary students who elect to enroll in vocational and technical education programs.

- 14. Interlocal Agreement with Alachua County (King Food Store) Birkett

This agreement is in collaboration with Alachua County for Tools for Schools.

- 15. School Bus Agreements Shelton

- a. Agreement with the City of Gainesville Department of Recreation and Parks to transport students for their summer programs June 10-August 8, 2003. Day camps will be located at various sites throughout the community.
- b. Agreement with the University of Florida Athletic Association to provide bus transportation for Softball Camp June 9-12, 2003.

- 16. Proposal to Add P.K. Yonge School Meals to Food Service Operation Chambers

The Department of Education (Food and Nutrition Management) and P.K. Yonge School have requested that Alachua School Food Service enter into an agreement to operate the P.K. Yonge Food Service program beginning this fall. It is

recommended that the School Board enter into an agreement to operate the school meal program for a one-year "pilot" period beginning this fall, and that an evaluation of the partnership be performed in the spring of 2004 to measure program acceptance and mutual benefit of both parties.
