1. Employment of Personnel--Attachments A & B Wright
2. Change Order(s) Approved Under Policy 8.53(1)--Attachment C Gable
3. Bid(s) and Requisition(s)—Attachment D Hackett
4. Memorandum of Understanding for Alachua County Foster Grandparent Program for the Period October 1, 2003, to September 30, 2006..... Scarborough

This program places senior volunteers at various school sites to serve children with special needs. The School Board agrees to provide school lunches for the foster grandparents.

5. Athletic Coaching Add-on Endorsement Program Lewis

State law requires that school districts issue coaching certificates to persons who do not hold a Florida Educator’s certificate, but who are paid to coach in public schools. District add-on endorsement programs accomplish this and are approved by the Department of Education for 5-year periods.
6. Agreement with Child Care Resources, Inc. Stark

Child Care Resources, Inc., provides subsidized child care for eligible families. Reimbursements are made monthly to the Extended Day Enrichment Program. Over 200 children are served each year through this program.
7. Bus Use Agreement with Santa Fe Community College Health Sciences Shelton

This agreement will provide transportation for college students in the Health Careers Opportunity Partnership Program August 15, 2003.
8. Inventory Droppage Report April 17, 2003 – July 7, 2003 McNeal

A list of equipment submitted for droppage from property records due to fair wear and tear, vandalism, theft, trade-ins, sales, etc. The droppage report is reported by property number, school, and classification summary.
9. Contract AC302 with Department of Health Black

This contract provides funding for nurses and clinic aides at certain schools.
10. Agreement with the University of Florida College of Dentistry, Department of Pediatrics Crowell

This agreement will provide dental services to approximately 400 Head Start/ Early Head Start/School Readiness children during the 2003-2004 school year.
11. Agreement with T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood Scholarship Program Crowell

This agreement will provide scholarships for Head Start/Early Head Start/School Readiness staff to work toward earning an AS degree in Child Development and Education or a Child Development Associate Credential and establish a partnership for the sharing of expenses by the scholarship recipient.
12. Dental Service Contract, Bertram Hughes, D.M.D.—Head Start/Early Head Start/ School Readiness Crowell

This agreement will provide dental services to approximately 400 Head Start/Early Head Start/School Readiness children during the 2003-2004 school year.
13. Agreement with Santa Fe Community College Crowell

This agreement will provide Child Development training for the Head Start/Early Head Start/School Readiness program and will cover the application fee, tuition, textbooks, and educational supplies.

14. Agreement with Alachua County Health Department Crowell

This agreement will provide health-related services to the 2003-2004 Head Start/ Early Head Start/School Readiness children and employees. A payment not to exceed \$112.06 per screening will be provided through grant funds for each student and employee.

15. Lease Agreement with DeSoto Charter High School Lewis

This agreement will allow DeSoto Charter High School to rent three classrooms from Prairie View Elementary School. Fifty percent of the rental monies will be returned to the school to support maintenance of facilities and enhance programs.
