1. Amendment to the 2004-2005 School Calendar Boyd

 The Bus Routes may be reviewed through CICS or the School Board web site.
- 7. Authorization to Pay Parents to Transport Students Shelton
 - a. Parent will transport student from the Gainesville area to Irby Elementary School, 47.3 miles per day. The cost to the district will be at the federal reimbursement rate and is retroactive to September 20, 2004.
 - b. Parent will transport, temporarily, two students from Williston road area to Shell Elementary School, 80 miles per day. The cost to the district will be at the federal reimbursement rate.
- 8. Amendment to Exhibit A of the Agreement with the Alachua County Sheriff's Office for the School Resource Deputy (SRD) Program Bryan
 It is recommended that the Reports paragraph of Exhibit A, Page 7, be amended to read, "The sheriff's Office shall develop a pilot program to report the SRD's work schedule. This report will be sent to the Superintendent on a quarterly basis."
- 9. Cooperative Agreements with Carlton Palms Educational Center, Inc. Black
 These agreements provide for two Alachua County students to receive special educational services that meet their needs as determined in the Individual Educational Plan. The School Board pays to Carlton Palms the amount generated by each student's FTE at a cost of \$14,946 for the 12-month duration of the contract. This is for the educational component only of each student's treatment plan.
- 10. Contractual Agreement between the Head Start/Early Head Start/School Readiness Program and ACORN Clinic Crowell
 This contract will provide for dental services to approximately eleven expectant mothers during the 2004-2005 school year.
- 11. Early Intervention Services Prenatal to Five-Year Old—Head Start Crowell
 A proposal has been prepared for submission to the Federal Administration for children and Families, Department of Health and Human Services to cover the cost of repairing and replacement of Head Start/Early Head Start facilities and/or equipment damaged due to Hurricane Frances. The total requested to replace playground equipment and a pavilion, remove fallen trees, and repair gutters, roofs and shingles is \$50,000.
- 12. Financial Agreement with Florida Healthy Kids Corporation Omer
 This agreement will provide health insurance coverage to eligible students and their families. Matching funds will be provided by Alachua County, United Way, and private contributions. No district funds will be used.

13. Interlocal Agreement with the City of Gainesville Omer

This agreement will provide for the Teen Zone program, an after-school program at Kanapaha and Westwood Middle Schools.

APPROVED CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT CHANGE ORDERS

- (1) Change Order Number Four for Project SBAC CC730—Archer Community School Renovate Existing Space for Classrooms

On September 22, 2004, the Superintendent authorized execution of Change Order Number Four to the construction contract. This change order adds \$11,880 to the contract, revising the contract total to \$921,635.67 and represents costs for: protection of existing wiring; acoustical tile @ existing corridor; additional fire alarm horn/lights; additional TV brackets; and additional door threshold. This change order adds seventy-one (71) consecutive calendar days to the contract time.
