2. Bid Award for Project SBAC CD744—Gainesville High School Tennis Courts (Task Order #2) Gable

Bids for the construction of this project were received on March 10, 2005.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: The administration recommends that the School Board accept the low base bid of \$409,876 and award a contract for construction to George Burns Enterprises, Inc., Gainesville, Florida. Completion of this project shall be within one hundred twenty (120) consecutive calendar days from the date indicated in the “Notice to Proceed.”

- 3. Bi-Tech Human Resources/Payroll System Addenda Utley

A plan for the Bi-Tech HR Payroll system has been developed with Bi-Tech to complete the HR/Payroll implementation, to implement the web based user interface, and to implement the Workflow system.
