14. Contractual Agreement with Meridian Behavioral Healthcare, Inc. Crowell
- This agreement provides for certain therapeutic and preventive mental health services for students served by the Fearnside Family Services Center, Head Start/School Readiness/Early Intervention programs. The funds are provided through federal and state grants.
15. Early Intervention Services – Head Start Prenatal to 5-Year-Old Program Crowell
- Proposals have been prepared for submission to the Federal Administration for Children and Families, Department of Health and Human Services for continued funding of the District’s Early Intervention Services Head Start – Prenatal to 5-Year-Old Program. The allocation for the 3-5 year old population is \$5,376,504 and the allocation for the prenatal to 3 year old and expectant mothers population is \$1,138,807.
16. Contract with T.E.A.C.H. (Teacher Education and Compensation Helps) Early Childhood Scholarship Program Crowell
- This contract provides scholarships for Head Start/Early Head Start/School Readiness staff to work toward earning an AS degree in Child Development and Education or a Child Development Associate Credential. The contract establishes a partnership for the sharing of expenses by the scholarship recipient, the Head Start/Early Head Start/School Readiness programs, and the T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood Scholarship program.
17. Comprehensive School Reform Omer
- A proposal has been prepared for submission to the Florida Department of Education to request additional funds to carry out the district’s Comprehensive School Reform grant at Rawlings Elementary School. A total of \$111,000 is requested to continue the implementation of the Success for All Reading program in conjunction with the district-adopted reading text, Trophies. This year Rawlings will work with district support staff and Success for All (SFS) staff to provide staff development/training to teachers starting fall of 2005.
18. Contract with District School Board of Putnam County on behalf of North East Florida Educational Consortium Omer
- This contract provides for specific services that outline professional and technical support activities provided by the Institute for Small and Rural Districts (ISRD). The purpose of the institute is to assist the 33 member school districts by conducting work sessions to address key state and federal initiatives impacting students with disabilities and those who are gifted.
19. Education for Homeless Children and Youth Omer
- A proposal has been prepared for submission to the Florida Department of Education to request additional funds to continue the district’s Education for Homeless Children and Youth grant. A total of \$150,000 is requested to employ a full-time social worker to coordinate provision of services for homeless students in all schools throughout the district. Funds will also be used to purchase materials and supplies to enable students to participate in a full range of school activities.

20. Even Start Grant Omer
- A proposal has been prepared for submission to the Florida Department of Education for a new grant to continue the district’s Even Start Family Literacy program. This program serves adults with literacy deficits and their children ages one to five. A total of \$312,130 is requested.
21. Florida Learn and Serve Grants Omer
- Proposals have been prepared for submission to the Florida Department of Education for continuation funding for the service learning projects at Expressions Learning Academy, Micanopy Area Cooperative School, and Santa Fe High School. New service learning projects are being proposed for Hoggetowne Middle School, the Horizon Center, and Westwood Middle School. A total of \$58,039 is requested.
22. Title V, Part A—Innovative Program Strategies Omer
- A proposal has been prepared for submission to the Florida Department of Education for Title V, Part A grant funds. The Title V program is to support local education reform and innovation.
23. United Way of North Central Florida Community Investment Agreement Omer
- An agreement has been prepared by United Way to contribute to the School Board of Alachua County \$33,000 for Healthy Kids insurance premiums. This program provides an affordable comprehensive health insurance package for school-age children who are not covered by private insurance or Medicaid.
24. 21st Century Community Learning Center Omer
- A proposal has been prepared for submission to the Florida Department of Education for a 21st Century Community Learning Center grant. This is a five year program that will provide after school programs at five Alachua County sites: Prairie View Elementary School, Waldo Community School, two Reichert House locations, and the Eastside Park Community Center. Program activities are designed to improve students’ academic performance, particularly in reading, and to provide students with engaging activities in a safe environment during times when school is not in session. Funds will be used for teacher stipends, fringe benefits, supplies, equipment, field trips, transportation for students, travel for required program meetings, and computer hardware and software.
25. E-Rate Funds—Proposed Computer Purchase for Ft. Clarke Middle School SRI Reading Lab Utley
- Ft. Clarke is one of ten schools upgraded from Token Ring to Ethernet using E-Rate funds this year. Due to older technology, Ft. Clarke is unable to conduct the computer-based SRI testing required by DOE four times each year. It is proposed that the district use \$32,956.16 of E-Rate funds to purchase 32 computers for the reading lab.
26. Cooperative Agreement with First Step Adolescent Services, Inc. Hall
- This agreement provides educational programs for eligible students at Alachua Residential Facility (aka: Halfway House for Girls).

- 27. Contract for Educational Services for Gainesville Wilderness Institute Hall
 This contract provides for educational services to meet the needs of students enrolled or remanded to Gainesville Wilderness Institute.
- 28. Cooperative Agreement with the Department of Juvenile Justice Hall
 This agreement provides educational programs for eligible students at North Florida Juvenile Detention Center.
- 29. Contract for Educational Services for PACE Centers for Girls Hall
 This contract designates the PACE Center for Girls as an approved deliverer of educational services to the youth services clients enrolled or remanded to its program.
- 30. Interagency Agreement for the Operation of the Alachua County Truancy Center Hall
 This agreement provides for the operation of the Alachua County Truancy Center with Corner Drugstore, Inc., Alachua County Sheriff's Office and Gainesville Police Department.
- 31. Title I NCLB—Supplemental Educational Services Contract—District/Provider .. Hall
 This Supplemental Educational Service agreement ("Contract") between the School Board of Alachua County, Florida, ("District") and the Provider is for the purpose of providing Supplemental Educational Services (SES) to Eligible students as agreed upon in the Title I NCLB—Supplemental Educational Services Parent/District/Provider Agreement.
