5. Proposed School Meal Prices 2005-06 ..... Chambers

Elementary lunch prices are recommended at \$1.75, secondary at \$1.90, and reduced price lunches would remain at \$.40; paid breakfast at all grades would remain at \$1.00, while reduced price breakfast would remain at \$.30. It is requested to pilot a second tier price in secondary schools as a lunch option--the upscale meal would be priced at \$2.00 and would allow students an additional selection of beverages. Economically needy students would be able to select the optional meal as well.

It is recommended that breakfast and lunch adult meals be made available offering a variety of meal combinations at various prices.

Meal prices at the P. K. Yonge School will be priced separately. Breakfast, \$1.00 all grades; Lunch, \$1.75 elementary, \$2.00 secondary and \$2.50 adult price.

APPROVED CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT CHANGE ORDERS

- (1) Change Order Number Two for Project SBAC A0034—Howard Bishop Middle School Science Laboratory Building

On June 23, 2005, the Superintendent authorized execution of Change Order Number Two to the construction contract. This change order does not change the contract sum. Construction was delayed due to industry circumstances and hurricane weather conditions beyond the Contractor's control. This change order adds seventy-four (74) consecutive calendar days to the contract time. This is the final change order for this project.

- (2) Change Order Number Two for Project SBAC C0032—Shell Elementary School Multi-Purpose Building

On June 23, 2005, the Superintendent authorized execution of Change Order Number Two to the construction contract.
